

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) for ArtsEverywhere@JLG: heART X Gardeners' Day Out 2026

General Event Information

1. What is ArtsEverywhere@JLG: heART? ArtsEverywhere@JLG: heART is a free, family-friendly carnival that brings together arts, nature, and wellness. This year's edition features art workshops, garden tours, fitness activities, a marketplace, and more — all set amidst the beautiful surroundings of Jurong Lake Gardens.

2. When and where is the event taking place? The event takes place on 13 & 14 June 2026 at Lakeside Field, Jurong Lake Gardens. Most activities run from 9am to 6pm, though individual programmes may have different timings. Please check the full programme on our website for details.

3. Is the event free to attend? Yes! All activities and workshops at ArtsEverywhere@JLG: heART are free to attend.

4. What happens if it rains on the day? All programmes are held under shelter and are rain-or-shine, so the event will proceed regardless of the weather. Do note that the bouncy castles will be temporarily closed during light rain, and guided garden tours will be cancelled in the event of heavy rain or lightning.

5. Is the event accessible by public transport? Yes! The nearest MRT station is Lakeside MRT (EW26), approximately 10 minutes' walk from the event. Bus services 154, 178, 240, and 246 stop along Yuan Ching Road. Please check Google Maps for the latest directions.

6. Is parking available at Jurong Lake Gardens? Yes, parking is available at the North Carpark. A drop-off and pick-up point is available at the Entrance Pavilion. Please check the Jurong Lake Gardens website for the latest information on parking charges.

7. Are pets allowed at the event? Jurong Lake Gardens is a pet-friendly park. However, please be mindful of other visitors and ensure your pets are on a leash at all times.

Workshops and Activities

8. How do I register for workshops? Registration details and links are available on our website. Some workshops are already open for registration, while others will open soon. We recommend registering early as slots are limited!

9. Are walk-in activities available without prior registration? Yes! Several activities are available on a walk-in basis throughout both days, including Airdry Claymaking, Shrink Art, Bouncy Castles, Project Blue Wave, and the MOLLY Mobile Library. No registration is needed — just turn up and join in the fun.

10. Can I register for more than one workshop? This depends on the individual workshop. For Crafted Identity workshops, participants may only register for one session due to limited slots. For other workshops, please check the respective registration pages for details.

11. What happens if I miss my registered workshop slot? We recommend arriving on time for your registered workshop as slots are limited and we may not be able to accommodate latecomers. If you are unable to attend, please cancel your registration so that your slot can be offered to others.

12. Can I attend if I have no prior art or gardening experience? Absolutely! All workshops are beginner-friendly and no prior experience is required. Our friendly facilitators will be on hand to guide you every step of the way.

13. Are the workshops accessible to people with disabilities? Several workshops are accessible to people with developmental and/or physical disabilities, including The Caged Parrot performance, Introduction to Watercolour Sketching for Seniors, and Playing with Negative Space. Please refer to the individual workshop listings on our website for accessibility information.

14. What is the age requirement for the various workshops? Age requirements vary by workshop. Some are open to all ages (3 and above), while others are designed for specific age groups such as young children, seniors, or families. Please check the individual workshop listings on our website for details.

Families and Children

15. Is the event suitable for young children? Yes! The event is designed to be family-friendly and welcoming to visitors of all ages. Many activities are suitable for children aged 3 and above, and there are dedicated workshops for young children and parent-child pairs.

16. Do children need to be accompanied by an adult? Parental supervision is advised for younger children, particularly for hands-on activities. Some workshops are specifically designed for parent-child pairs, so do check the individual listings before registering.

17. Are strollers allowed at the event? Yes, strollers are welcome. All event locations are wheelchair- and stroller-accessible.

Marketplace and Other Activities

18. What can I find at the Gardeners' Day Out Marketplace? The Gardeners' Day Out Marketplace features potted plants, gardening gear, and a variety of nature-inspired items. This edition will also include a special booth from NParks' Pasir Panjang Nursery, so do pop by!

19. Do I need to register for the kayaking and pedal boat try-outs? No prior registration is needed — registration for kayaking and pedal boat try-outs is done on-site at the tentage on the day itself. Try-outs are available from 9am to 4pm on both days.

20. Can I bring my own plants for the NParks Plant Clinic? Yes! You are welcome to bring your plants or photos of your plants for a free walk-in assessment by our specialists. The Plant Clinic runs from 9am to 3pm on both days.

21. Are there any freebies or giveaways at the event? Yes! The first 150 visitors each day will receive a complimentary welcome pack. There is also a Stamp Rally — collect at least 2 stamps from any of the three Visitor Service Counters at Jurong Lake Gardens (Entrance Pavilion at Lakeside Garden, Pagoda Plaza at Chinese Garden, or WaterLily Pavilion at Japanese Garden) to redeem an Eden voucher at the Info Counter. Do bring your own notebook or paper to collect your stamps!

Accessibility

22. Is the event wheelchair-friendly? Yes, all event locations are wheelchair-accessible.

23. Which workshops are accessible to people with disabilities? The following workshops are accessible to people with disabilities: The Caged Parrot (developmental and physical disabilities), Introduction to Watercolour Sketching for Seniors (physical disabilities), and Playing with Negative Space (physical disabilities). Please refer to our website for the full list of accessible programmes.

Getting Around the Event

24. Where are the toilets? The nearest toilets are at Clusia Cove or the PAssionWaVe building, approximately 5 minutes' walk from the main event area. Accessible toilets are available at both locations.

25. Where can I get food and drinks? Food and drinks are available at the Gardeners' Day Out Marketplace (9am – 3pm) or at Fusion Spoon, the nearest F&B outlet at Lakeside Garden.

26. Where do the Garden Tours start and end? All Garden Tours start from Gardenhouse and end at Forest Ramble. Please make your way to Gardenhouse before your tour's start time.

27. Where is the nearest first aid station? The nearest Visitor Service Counter and AED are located at the Entrance Pavilion. For emergencies, please call 995 (ambulance/fire) or 999 (police).
